EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report highlights the most prominent football clubs and players of the season across Great Britain (GB) and the United States (US). While there is strong overlap between the two markets—particularly among elite Premier

League clubs and globally recognized players—distinct differences emerge in player preference, reflecting variations in media exposure, league narratives, and audience engagement patterns.

Key Market Comparisons and Insights



Shared Leaders

Liverpool and Manchester United rank among the top teams in both markets, underscoring their global reach and sustained relevance.



Star Power Matters

Mohamed Salah and Erling Haaland are the only players to appear in both markets' top-player lists, underscoring their exceptional cross-market appeal, despite Salah generating almost as many headlines off the pitch as on it.



Local vs Global Preferences

- GB audiences show stronger affinity for domestic and culturally embedded players.
- US audiences lean toward globally visible stars and standout performers regardless of club stature.



Strategic Marketing Interpretation

Chelsea's elevated U.S. ranking highlights how international fandom is frequently anchored in long-term brand building, driven by historic achievements and consistent media presence, rather than by current league performance.

CONCLUSION

While Great Britain and the United States share core football loyalties, meaningful differences remain in how fans engage with teams and players. GB audiences prioritize league familiarity and national context, while US audiences gravitate toward globally marketed clubs and high-profile individuals. These distinctions are critical for media strategy, sponsorship alignment, and international fan growth initiatives.



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
